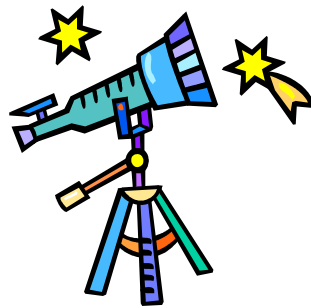

CAS Board Meeting at 6:00 pm in the lobby of the Church. All are welcome.

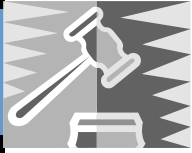
Thomas Hill Lake Field Trip Saturday November 21st 7:30 AM

There will be no regularly scheduled meeting in December. Instead chapter members are strongly encouraged to participate in the annual Christmas Bird Count (CBC). The date is Saturday, December 19, 2009.



Prior to the bird count, there will be an organizational meeting at Susan Hazelwood's home, 3005 Chapel Hill Rd, at 7:30 PM on Thursday, December 3th. Section leaders, individuals interested in becoming section leaders and those wanting to learn more about the count should attend. Everyone is welcome to come.

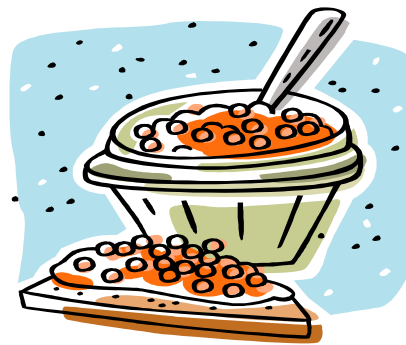
Besides section leaders, counters, recorders, spotters, and drivers are needed for the count. You do not have to be a birder to participate. We also need stay-at-home folks who count birds at their feeders. See sidebar.

If you would like to participate, call Susan Hazelwood at (573) 445-4925 and leave a message. If you have previously participated and know which team you want to join, let Susan or your section leader know. Otherwise, Susan will assign you to a section in need of additional observers and counters.

The Columbia CBC covers a 7.5 mile radius centered on Rock Bridge Elementary School. We split into approximately 13 teams. Each team is assigned an area within the circle and each team will bird their area for most of the day.

We will conclude the day with the annual compiling session and chili dinner. They will take place at 6:00 pm on Saturday December 19 at the

Community of Christ Church located at 1111 Fairview Road in Columbia (formerly called the Reorganized Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints). It is south of Fairview Elementary School. The room will be open at 5:00 pm for food set-up. We usually have venison and buffalo chili and meatless chili, too, for those who have a preference along with veggies and desserts. The cost of dinner has yet to be determined but it is based on the cost of



beverages, paper products, ice, and room rental. If you have questions about the chili dinner please phone Vanessa Melton at (573) 864-3905 and leave a message. She will return your call.

The compiling session will be lead by Jim Gast following the chili dinner. It is a chance for all to hear about what birds were most common and what species were missed. We'll also learn if there were any unexpected species found.

The Christmas Bird Count is about "Citizen Science" at work. It reflects volunteers (citizen scientists) collecting data for scientific use. Our data from years past was prominent in the US Fish and Wildlife Service's first ever, *2009 State of the Birds Report* to Congress and 40 years of CBC data was the backbone of Audubon's *2009 Birds and Climate Change* report.

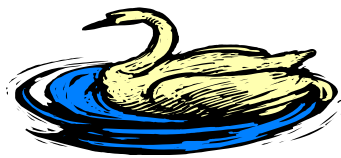

**The Citizen Science/
Conservation Program
for Trumpeter Swans**

Though restoration of Trumpeter Swans throughout historic breeding areas of the Midwest and Great Plains has been highly successful, most of the flocks remain vulnerable. Historically much of the interior population migrated to favorable sites south of the 40th parallel. Today, a small percentage of the flocks are exploring and possibly pioneering routes into their historic winter range. Trumpeter Swans are showing up in new locations, some they have not frequented for over 100 years. Audubon members and fellow birders are asked for help to document and then monitor winter habitat use in twenty states of the Central, Southern and eastern U.S. Observers are asked to register with TRUMPETER WATCH, a program of The Trumpeter Swan Society. Identification guidelines and data forms to be printed for field use can be found on line. Photographic documentation is useful.
